Because Indigenous knowledge has often been referred to as "traditional knowledge," some people view it as unchanging knowledge based only in the past. Instead it is "an adaptable, dynamic system based on skills, abilities, and problem-solving techniques that change over time depending on environmental conditions" (Battiste, 2005).
